## Our Golf Club Facilities

Here at Lyme Regis Golf Club we have a variety of facilities for our members and visitors:

<b>Course</b>	We have a Championship 18-hole course.
<b>Driving Range</b>	This can be used by all golfers. Discounts are available to members or purchasing of multiple tokens. Tokens can be purchased through the Professional's Shop. Baskets are by the ball machine and must be returned to the basket container at the Driving Range.
<b>Practice Area</b>	A practice/chipping area with net is available, exclusive to members, member's guests and green fee visitors.
<b>Buggy Store</b>	A buggy/trolley shed is available where you can store and charge your push and electric equipment at an additional cost.
<b>Clubhouse</b>	<p>Our Clubhouse has a large contemporary dining room, restaurant and general bar open to both golfers and visitors.</p> <p>We also have changing rooms including showers and lockers to place your valuables in.</p>
<b>Professional's Shop</b>	<p>Our well stocked golf Pro Shop is currently stocking Callaway, Ping, Titleist and Taylormade equipment, along with Titleist golf balls, Skechers shoes, Motocaddy trollies and a large range of golfing apparel.</p> <p>A full custom fit studio is also available using Trackman.</p> <p>Trolleys and buggies can also be hired from here.</p> <p>The shop is open seven days a week and non-members are very welcome.</p>



## Club Information

All of our Club information can be found on our website or within the HowDidiDo members' area which is updated regularly with social events, news and important messages. Additional information can also be accessed via our notice boards and newsletters.

**Notice boards** These are located in the main entrance and ladies changing rooms and are a good source of information for members. Some notices are there for information such as dress code, but others require your input, such as signing up for matches, entering competitions and social activities.

**Club Newsletters** Club newsletters are emailed to all members on a regular basis. These give you important updates on the course, clubhouse, along with upcoming events and general information. It is important to read this as it will cover any rule changes and AGM notices.

**Club Draw** A monthly draw for members is held supporting the Club Projects Fund. It is a great way to support your club whilst having the opportunity to win some excellent prizes. This is held the last Friday of each month with a "Mega Draw" at the end of the year.

The draw is open to all members and staff within the club over the age of 18. 65% of the raised funds go to the Club Projects Fund to be used for the benefit of Lyme Regis Golf Club and its members. The remaining funds is divided into two prizes – 1<sup>st</sup> 25% and 2<sup>nd</sup> 10% . Join now!

## Club Rules

An important part of our golf club membership is that members are aware of club rules and abide by them. They are there to make the game more enjoyable and to help with the smooth running of the club.

A copy of The Lyme Regis Golf Club Constitution and Club Rules can be found on our website and within the HowDidiDo members' area.

## Dress Code

The general principle is that visitors and members shall conform to the best of golf standards on both the Course and in the Clubhouse and be of smart and tidy appearance.

These dress rules are for the guidance of Members and visitors and are intended to be open, understandable and workable and to be consistent with standards of dress considered acceptable at modern-day golf clubs.

The rules are not intended to be fully prescriptive, and are in some cases open to interpretation, but Members are expected to take personal responsibility for observing standards of dress that reflect well on themselves and the Club.

Visitors, visiting societies, visiting teams and those participating in open competitions are required to comply with these dress rules. It is up to Members to ensure that their individual guests are advised accordingly.

Juniors are encouraged to dress in consideration to this Dress Code.

### On the Course



- All golf style shirts, including turtleneck
- Ladies may wear sleeveless golf shirts
- Tailored shorts
- Recognised golf shoes



- Sleeveless shirts for men, football or rugby shirts
- Shirts with large lettering or numbers
- Track suits
- Blue denim jeans
- Football, rugby or beach shorts
- Football or rugby socks or no socks at all
- Anything other than recognised golf shoes

## Registering on Club Systems

Our club software systems are provided by Club Systems and central to this is the HowDidiDo members' hub.

It is important that you register on the HowDidiDo Hub either by downloading the app or going through our website members' area. In doing this you are ensuring HowDidiDo is able to update you with regards to your personal handicap changes and competition results.

You can gain access to tee time reservations via the BRS app and additional information regarding your handicap via the England Golf app, both of which require you to register.

The England Golf app will require your unique CDH number which can be obtained from the office.

When registering on HowDidiDo, we would request members to give their permission for access to their telephone numbers and email addresses as they are important when entering competitions so that members can contact you to arrange games.

## HowDidiDo Guide

HowDidiDo is the essential communication hub for all LRGC members.

Within this secure area is a variety of information ranging from Club Rules and minutes of management meetings and club diary, through to important details regarding club competitions. You can even top up your bar card!

By logging into this hub, you are not only enabling yourselves to access these documents, you are also, if you enter your personal details, enabling your fellow members to contact you.

There are privacy settings contained within the hub which ensure your personal data is secure and not freely available outside of the site.

- **How to install the HowDidiDo App**  
Visit your App Store > Download HowDidiDo App and link to Lyme Regis GC.
- **How to contact other Members**  
Club members can be viewed using the HowDidiDo App. Should you wish to view their contact details (i.e. to arrange a KO match and assuming their have permitted this in their profile), you currently have to access the Members Hub App to view such details. This will be ported across to the HowDidiDo App during 2026.



- **How to update your personal details**  
Open the HowDidiDo App > open the 'profile' option (circle at top right) and then choose profile to update your personal details.
- **How to share you personal details with other members of LRGC**  
Open the HowDidiDo App>open the 'profile' option, choose preferences, the privacy tab in the right hand corner allows you to choose which details you would like to make available.
- **How to enter a competition**

Open the HowDidiDo App > tap the competitions button and view / book a competition tee time accordingly.

## Booking Tee Times

Tee times must be reserved via our BRS booking system. This can be accessed either by the use of the ClubV1 HowDidiDo App (under the 'club' option on the home page, scroll to the bottom and then press the link to BRS – you will have to enter your ID number and password) or via the BRS app.

Members can book up to two weeks in advance and visitors one week.

Members need to be aware that the Club operates a rotational system whereby two and three ball matches are booked on one nine whilst the other nine holes are for three and four ball games. You must book in the appropriate area.

## Handicaps

In order to either enter a Club competition or represent the Club in inter-club team matches you must have an England Golf registered handicap.

If you are already a member of another club your unique CDH number will enable your handicap to be transferred to LRGC.

If you do not have a handicap then you must submit cards representing 54 holes of golf. You must play with either a member of LRGC or another recognised golf club and then you submit either an 18 hole or 9 hole card. These cards must be entered into the computer terminal and placed in the competitions box. Once you have cumulated 54 holes, England Golf will calculate a handicap. This will be shown on the HowDidiDo App or the England Golf App. a handicap will be awarded via England Golf.

## General Play

Lyme Regis Golf Club is a very friendly club and welcomes all new members.

A principal vehicle for this is via a number of weekly roll ups which are in place. The concept of a roll up is to allow any member, irrespective of their playing ability, to join in and the roll up organisers must accommodate you.

A list of roll up organisers and timings are available within the HowDidiDo members' hub.

## Competitions and Matches

We run various club competitions which vary in format and will endeavour to cater for golfers of all abilities. Some will be run at the club, others may involve playing at other clubs, through alliances and local leagues - speak to your Club Manager for further information should you wish to be involved.

A full list of competitions and knockouts can be found in the Club Diary within the HowDidiDo App.

### **Stableford Competitions**

This is a popular format for competitions, as one or two bad holes do not stop you competing as per the medal format. Rather than the number of shots for the hole, you have a point system.

Points are awarded in the following way:

- |                                 |          |
|---------------------------------|----------|
| ▪ Above Bogey                   | 0 Points |
| ▪ Bogey (1 shot over par)       | 1 Point  |
| ▪ Par                           | 2 Points |
| ▪ Birdie (1 shot under par)     | 3 Points |
| ▪ Eagle (2 shots under par)     | 4 Points |
| ▪ Albatross (3 shots under par) | 5 Points |

Your shots are based on your handicap as follows:

- A player off 6 handicap gets a shot at the holes with stroke index 1-6



- A player off 18 handicap gets a shot at each hole
- A player off 24 handicap gets 2 shots at stroke index holes 1-6 and 1 shot at stroke index holes 7-18.

**Medal Competitions (Handicap)**

This is the format most commonly used by golf clubs for their monthly medals and other medal competitions. A player subtracts their handicap away from the total shots taken to give their nett score.

**Medal Competitions (Scratch)**

This is where only gross scores count, handicaps are not taken consideration. The format is normally used for category 1 golfers. The Club Championship usually uses this format.

**Foursomes**

In this format players (in pairs) hit alternate shots. Each player will hit 9 tee shots and then take it in turns until holing out. It is a quick format of golf as players can walk ahead to a point near to where their partner will hit the ball. You can either play in a medal or stableford format.

**Greensome**

This format is very similar to foursomes, the difference being that both players tee off at each hole, then pick one of the players drives (normally the best one) and the other player then plays and in turn from there until holding out.

**Texas Scramble**

This is played in a 3 or 4 player team format. You all tee off, all the players hit their second shot from where the best drive landed, then all hit a 3<sup>rd</sup> from where the best 2<sup>nd</sup> shot finished and so on until the hole is completed.

**Match Play**

A form of competition in which each hole is a separate competition, players can either win, lose or halve a hole, the winner is determined by the number of holes won rather than the gross, nett or stableford score. Once a player is up by a number of holes and there are less holes left to play then they have won, ie 5 up with 4 holes to play, the player has won 5&4. If a match is all square at the end, then you may need to play extra holes until there is a winner, referred to as sudden death.

**Knockouts**

Using the match play format, most clubs will run a variety of knockout competitions, these can either be singles, foursomes, better ball, mixed or for handicap categories.



## Ladies and Seniors Sections

### The Ladies Section

The Ladies Committee meet once a month to review and plan ahead to ensure that all events are run efficiently and that there are events, competitions and activities for all lady members whatever their level of ability.

### Thursday and Saturday are Ladies Competition Days.

Competitions include:

- Medals and Stableford Qualifiers
- Cup and Trophy Competitions
- Team and Fun competitions

Roll Ups are held on Mondays and Tuesdays.

### League Matches

- Woods Singles Match Play for handicaps 20.5 and above

### Interclub

- Singles Match Play for handicaps 20.4 and below

### Driver Golf Academy

Our popular Driver Golf Academy is predominantly for beginners to golf, focussing on ball striking on the driving range and in the short game practice area. Participants can then progress to playing a few holes on the course under the supervision of our PGA Fellow Professional, assisted by experienced full playing members.

Finally, participants are then assessed to be “Course Ready” and they can then progress to playing on the course and join LRGC.

### Gaining a Handicap

- England Golf allows for any responsible adult to mark a card for handicapping purposes. LRGC recommends that wherever possible this is done by a person who has a golf handicap
- Members are usually available at roll ups to mark cards. When playing outside of roll up times, markers can be arranged through the coordinator or Committees
- When a volunteer is accompanying two new players, they will mark cards for both players. However, the two new players should be encouraged to mark each other's card to learn the process
